Jonathan Tarr Foundation Scholarship (Additional Scholarship)

One PIFA high school recipient will be awarded the JTF scholarship. To be eligible you must submit your FAFSA for the 2018-2019 academic school year. A receipt of submission will be required along with the requirements listed below.

Required Enclosures

- [1] Recent photo (wallet size hardcopy and jpg version on disk)
 - [2] Official High School transcripts – **Minimum of 3.0 Overall GPA** (most recent semester required, January 2019, transcript must be signed with official seal, in an enclosed sealed envelope. Applicant must be a full time student).
 - [3] Letter of acceptance to community college, university or trade school.
 - [4] Two letters of recommendations to PIFA, 1- from a school teacher or counselor, AND 1- from community leader or employer.
 - [5] Essay stating accomplishments, leadership or scholastic honors/awards, Pacific Islander and community involvement/service, goals for the future and how you plan to give back to PIFA. Fill out all 4 sections (see below)
 - [6] Applicant must be available for interview with Scholarship Review Committee.
 - [7] Copy of receipt of submission for FAFSA 2017-2019 (To be eligible for JTF Scholarship)
 - [8] Proof of ethnicity (Melanesian, Micronesian or Polynesian descent). Examples: Birth certificate, parent birth certificate, registry, etc.
- Application must be complete or will not be accepted. Applicant may submit additional written work, photos or video with application requirements. All applicants will be scored using a 5-point rubric created by the PIFA Scholarship Committee for evaluation. Please examine each category carefully when submitting your application:
- Category 1: High School Academics
- Strength of academic program, as evidence by the number of advanced placement or honors courses completed
 - Cumulative rank
 - College weighted grade point average
- Category 2: Community Service
- Community service (e.g., tutoring, mentoring, volunteer work, fundraising, etc.)
 - Leadership skills (e.g., executive positions in any organization, leading youth groups, school or civic involvement)
 - Civic Involvement (e.g., participating in public/private partnerships, volunteering on behalf of city programs and services, addressing/advocating the city council on issues of interest to the community, etc.)
- Category 3: Participation in promoting culture
- Cultural Arts or Dance Groups
 - Community work within the Pacific Islander community
- Category 4: Potential Goals to Contribute to Community of Pacific Islanders
- How applicant will give back to Pacific Islander community
 - Native language skills
 - Knowledge of your Pacific Islander ancestry
- Category 5: Letters of recommendation
- Must have minimum of two letters of recommendation attached addressed to PIFA
